Investigating this, let us look at the life of King David.

12 ... David went down and brought up the ark of God from the house of Obed-Edom to the City of David with rejoicing... 14 David, wearing a linen ephod, danced before the LORD with all his might, 15 while he and the entire house of Israel brought up the ark of the LORD with shouts and the sound of trumpets. 16 As the ark of the LORD was entering the City of David, Michal daughter of Saul watched from a window. And when she saw King David leaping and dancing before the LORD, she despised him in her heart. 2 Sam. 6:12, 14-16 (NIV)

David understood that celebrating is a part of worship. He celebrated the ark's return to Jerusalem out of his love and reverence for the LORD.

David's celebrating also showed those watching the appropriate way to honor God.

Another byproduct of celebrating is that heart motives are revealed. David's wife Michal did not participate in the celebration physically or with her heart, otherwise she would have seen past his "undignified behavior" and loved David all the more for his worshipful heart.

Our celebration honors our Heavenly Father, shows new believers how to live lives of celebration, and exposes ungrateful attitudes and other ungodly mindsets that may be in the people we influence or in ourselves.

Omega and Alpha, yes, I know what I am saying. Oh, yes you may feel as though I have it backwards. You may think it should be said Alpha and Omega, the first and the last. Yes, Jesus is the Alpha and the Omega.

The End Is A Beginning

Think back on your own life. hasn't every ending been followed by a new beginning? Let's look at some examples. Each night is followed by a new day.
