Remember Gideon. The plan of battle God gave him seemed ludicrous. [a] but God gave his people the victory. The plans the Israelis followed in the Six Day War seemed impossible, but God gave them great victory.

What is God calling you to do that seems impossible? Remember Luke 1:37 tells us, "For nothing is impossible with God." There may be some work, change, and sacrifice necessary, on your part, but if you are faithful, the result of your obedience, faith, and trust in God, will be beyond your comprehension.

"Time" (Teaching Sketch)
Matthew 25:14-30

Time is a gift, a tool, an opportunity. Time starts when physical life begins, and ends when physical life ends.

Then there is eternity. Time is measured existence while eternity is existence without measurement.

Killing Time

When asked what they are doing many people will respond with, "Oh, just killing time." Time can be wasted, squandered, invested, and utilized, but you cannot kill time. Only the Creator of time can affect time. There is the example of when a prophet through the power of the Creator caused time to stand still. Time may be a measure of our gift of it, but time comes closer to killing us than we to killing it.

Distractions

Our world, in the time in which we live, is full of distractions. Yes, we may call them amusements, worries, or obligations but if they cause us to lose sight of our Lord and his desired use of our lives all of these things are distractions. It is amazing just how much money people will spend on distractions and brag about doing it! Amusement, however, is not the only distraction which diverts attention away from our Lord's purposes. As was mentioned earlier worry, misplaced obligations and even painful health can also play a part in being distracted from our Master's purposes.

Servants With Talents

Matthew records a parable of Jesus as he instructs his hearers regarding the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus tells them of three servants who were each given a different amount of silver to care for while their master would be gone from them for an undisclosed period of time. Jesus says each was given an amount according to their ability.

At Once

Immediately means "at once." The one given the most went at once to care for

his master's money. Let me point out here, money is not the only thing of value which is give to people. Money, however, will get nearly everyone's attention and can be easily measured for results. You see the master had an end in mind when he left his wealth with his servants.

Results Not Intensions

Jesus' desire, as our Master, is to share with us his happiness. Jesus is looking for and desirous of results of increase from each of his servants. He makes it very clear his desire is to share with his servants the good of the Kingdom of Heaven. This is seen in his response to the first two servants who brought him increase, but to the servant who brought no increase he was very displeased! Jesus stripped the servant with no increase of what he had and gave it to those with an increase plus he kicked him out of the Kingdom of Heaven!

Be Wise

Be wise not foolish. Don't allow fear, worry, health, finances, procrastination, or laziness to let your time run out... expire before you show yourself to be a faithful servant!
