"Grace And Gifts" (Teaching Sketch) Ephesians & 2 Timothy

When God blesses mankind it is an act of grace.^[1] Grace, when applied to the Believer, reaches far beyond the common grace experienced by all people. The common grace we would readily identify as life and the

environment in which all live out their "natural" lives. All and any grace is a gift, an unearned gift.

Receiving Gifts

Many times when the Apostle Paul greeted Believers in his letters, and probably in person, he would speak, "Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." Paul was not only speaking a blessing to and over them but was reiterating what is actually made clear in Ephesians 2 when Paul says what has been translated "in the ages to come." The Greek word used there is aion^(G165) This word speaks of a space or period of time, in this case until the end of time, ie. perpetuity. Remember, in the last session it was pointed out, time is in itself a gift of and form of grace. It is revealed in scripture that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. ⁷ He did this that He might clearly demonstrate through the ages to come the immeasurable (limitless, surpassing) riches of His free grace (His unmerited favor) in [His] kindness and goodness of heart toward us in Christ Jesus.

Giving Gifts

The giving of gifts to God by the Believer is done not to receive eternal life, salvation, or anything else but as a thank offering to God for the matchless gift of grace, not to earn what has already been given.

Giving to God and obeying him is a thank offering for all he has given the Believer!

Stir Up The Gifts!

The Apostle Paul makes it clear to Timothy it is his responsibility to stir up-rekindle the embers of the gifts he has been given by God. People often simply wait for God to move on them to "feel the power or unction" to use their gifts. No! The gifts are theirs. Gifts are there to be used. It is the responsibility of the Believer to keep the gifts stirred into flames themselves. Back to the gift of the car. What would it be like if the person who received the car as a gift expected the giver of the car to drive the car for them? Well God expects people to use the gifts he has given. Yes, God wants to provide for his people the fuel, maintenance, insurance, safety, and guidance but he expects us to take part and drive within his provision. God did not give us timidity, cowardice, or fear. The gifts are to be used!

Just so you'll know: Our service is informal. We look to the Holy Spirit of God to guide us corporately and individually.
