Peter reminds us that as Believers we are peculiar people, a people belonging to God, a chosen people. (1 Peter 2:9) As such, we Believers are to do some things that just do not make sense to those who are not Believers in Jesus the Christ. For example:

25"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? ... ²⁷Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?

²⁸"And why do you worry about clothes? See how the lilies of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. ²⁹Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. ³⁰If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? ³¹So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' ... ³³But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Matthew 6:25, 27-31, 33 (NIV) (Emphasis added.)
