Acts 2:1-13 (NIV)

The Apostle Luke being a man of medicine, a scientist, was a man who needed solid evidence before he would stamp his credibility on a matter. Luke certainly managed to do this in his historical rendering, the Book Notes: of Acts of The Apostle.

We will now peel to a layer of this onion beyond the obvious story to the hidden story, the secrets of The Kingdom. It is the glory of kings to search out a matter.[1]

So many people, those who call themselves Christian and those who do not, seem unwilling to search out the matter of Pentecost and how what happened then continues today. They choose to rely on their own understanding as the world relies on its own understanding.

Having little or no understanding of history they conclude the miraculous manifestations died out after the first century, because they see little evidence of the reality of Pentecost power as was witnessed that day in Jerusalem.

This false line of thinking, un-

fortunately, leads to each person freelancing on the understanding of the Holy Spirit.

The result of this has become those who call

themselves "true" Christians agreeing with the crowd that day in Jerusalem. "They have had too much wine." Note this opinion came from those who had not experienced the wind and fire of the Holy Spirit themselves. Many people have heard me often say, "A person with an experience is never at the mercy of a person with an argument." Well, the people who misevaluated the events back then and now only had or have an argument. They have not searched

out a matter.

When the story is told to the person who does not believe. they are given hope for themselves to place their trust in Jesus Christ and be saved, healed, delivered, and preserved, (which is the meaning of the original Greek word "sozo" used, which was translated "saved.") Notice the very word itself shows the power of God.

language. ⁷Utterly amazed, they asked: "Are not all these men who are speaking Galileans? ⁸Then how is it that each of us hears them in his own native language? ⁹Parthians, Medes and Elamites: residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome 11 (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs-we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" 12 Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine. [b]"

Just so you'll know:

Our service is informal. We look to the Holy Spirit of God to guide us corporately and individually.

- The Pastoral Message
- Prayer Requests
 - Ministry to those present & intercession.
- The Blessing

Paul wrote in Romans 15:18-19: "I will not venture to speak of anything except what Christ has accomplished through me in leading the Gentiles to obey God by what I have said and done— by the power of signs and miracles, through the power of the Spirit. So from Jerusalem all the way around to Illyricum, I have fully proclaimed the gospel of Christ."

Paul said he "fully proclaimed" all there is in Christ.

Yes, a new Believer may have the Holy Spirit in them but may never have experienced the power that only comes through a Pentecost experience.

This is the reason so many Believers live lives as victims rather than victors. Even many who claim to have had a Pentecost experience do not practice drawing upon it because they have not remained in, or ever had their minds renewed in, a Biblical world view and understanding. The Holy Spirit is given by the asking, in faith, to be filled with the Holy Spirit's power.

It is important to remember that when the Spirit came, power came to them because they were where Christ told them to remain until it happened. This again was on a feast day. The day of Pentecost.

Resurrecting Pentecost

We now live in a time when we need to heed the words of the prophets and recognize that these are the days of power being thrust back into all believers who will accept God flowing through them in power to demonstrate the truth of God's Word to a lost, floundering, and dying world. These days are the days foretold long ago.

Believer, if you are not drawing on the power of the Holy Spirit either because you have never experienced the infilling or have ignored the Spirit's power available to you, take action immediately.

We must not be slow of heart in this hour for we have more scripture to understand and function in than the first century church.

Back then, 2000 years ago, people accepted the Spirit as a given. Pentecost power was readily seen and sought in the Body of Christ for all who were not slow of heart to function in the Word and receive it. Today is no different! The Holy Spirit is still revealing and demonstrating this truth. Believers, you are not victims, but victors!
