



"You Are A Seed" (Teaching Sketch) Luke 8: 5-15 (NIV)

Jesus, when he told the "Parable of the Sower," set in motion several layers of understanding of the scriptures.



Where Seed Falls

A seed has little or no ability to determine where it falls and, therefore, is planted. The outcome of a seed and its germination are dependent upon where it is. We are the same! We are to grow and produce where we are planted or Holy Spirit dispatched!

Insight as to the challenges of life can be seen in the examples of what Jesus said happens to a non-husbanded seed. We must allow the Holy Spirit to husband us.

• Along path—trampled & eaten by birds of air

• On rock - withered no moisture- no baptism

• Among thorns - choked by unbelievers

• On good soil yields a hundredfold crop, 1) watered 2) encouraged 3) nourished.

Have You Ears?

Do you have ears? Are you able to listen and are you teachable? Do you do what you hear is to be done? Faith comes by hearing the Word of God, (regular exposure to the Word)! We, unlike other seeds, are able to repair our conditions wherever we are. It is not the conditions in which we find ourselves but how we respond to conditions which determine our growth toward harvest. Our life's purpose is to grow a harvest as worship to God!

⁵"A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path; it was trampled on, and the birds of the air ate it up. ⁶Some fell on rock, and when it came up, the plants withered because they had no moisture. ⁷Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up with it and choked the plants. ⁸Still other seed fell on good soil. It came up and yielded a crop, a hundred times more than was sown." When he said this, he called out, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear." ⁹His disciples asked him what this parable meant. ¹⁰He said, "The knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of God has been given to you, but to others I speak in parables, so that, " 'though seeing, they may not see; though hearing, they may not understand.'^[a] ¹¹"This is the meaning of the parable: The seed is the word of God. ¹²Those along the path are the ones who hear, and then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, so that they may not believe and be saved. ¹³Those on the rock are the ones who receive the word with iov when they hear it, but they have no root. They believe for a while, but in the time of testing they fall away. ¹⁴The seed that fell among thorns stands for those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by life's worries, riches and pleasures, and they do not mature. ¹⁵But the seed on good soil stands for those with a noble and good heart, who hear the word, retain it, and by persevering produce a crop.

Just so you'll know:

True understanding comes via a regularly cultivated relationship with Christ. Believers have been given the gift of understanding—if you are a believer (one who trusts in, relies on Jesus the Christ) you can understand.

Your Soil is the Key

You have control over yourself, where you grow and what you allow to grow in you. Your soil is your choice. The quality of theseed you are will depend upon how you nourish it.

What Seeds Do you Pant?

Jesus made it clear that a seed that survives the knocks of life yields a harvest. When

Believers are transferred from this existence to their reward they are expected to have a harvest for The Kingdom.

Notice here the word "yields." When Believers produce, they must yield or give away (gift) some of themselves to produce seeds that will, in turn, grow healthily and, produce a hundredfold crop. It is then Believers will reap a reward of blessing as good and faithful servants of our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ! Grow, go, plant, and raise the crop of Christ!
