They do not labor or spin. ²⁹Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. ³⁰If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith?³¹So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' ... ³³But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Matthew 6:25, 27-



I had rather be a door-keeper in the house of my God, than to dwell in the tents of wickedness. ¹¹For the Lord God is a sun and shield: the Lord will give grace and glory: no good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly. ¹²O Lord of hosts, blessed is the man that trusteth in thee.^[a]

The blessing of mankind is God's desire and will for all mankind! You say, “I don't feel very blessed. If you only knew what I must deal with every day and the people in my family, neighborhood, or work.”

Your right, I may not know each and every challenge you face each day but God does!

Happiness

These things, about which many complain, are events or happenings in any given day. When feelings rule our lives they are attached to happenings. Happenings and our interpretation of them are thereby feelings translated into happiness or the lack of happiness. It is this view which often destroys faith. I often hear people ask me, “How can I increase my faith?” My answer is: “Understand The Blessing!”

Joy

Before we look at The Blessing let's look at joy. Now, joy is not dependent on happenings or feelings. Actually, feelings are tied to joy. If I am a joyful person, I am joy-filled. If I am joy-filled then my interpretation of events will not deprive me of my joy

because I know events change, can be changed, or will change. A joyful person is a hope-filled person. Hope is much like a savings account you either posses it, or you don't.

Many people have heard the words from the Book of Nehemiah. “... for the joy of the Lord is our strength.”^{Neh. 8:10 KJV} This verse is especially used in connection with spiritual warfare and believe me, without the joy of the Lord a person is too weak for a spiritual battle. So why do people of faith seem to be so full of the joy of the Lord?

Blessing

When a person understands The Blessing they cannot help but be joyful because they know “no weapon formed against them will prosper.”^{Is: 54:17 KJV} Now that is blessed!

The Kingdom Of Joy
God's Kingdom is the Kingdom of Blessing and all who reside in it live in and under The Blessing! When I know my condition is one of being continually blessed then I am filled with the joy of the Lord. **The joy of the Lord is of Christ, and is the same yesterday, today, and for ever!**
