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

We Understand

Verse three informs us that we can understand the universe and many things by faith. The things of God seem as foolishness to the person without faith. That is the way it is with us before we believe through faith coming to us, all things of God seem foolish.

We Act

We act on our faith (v. 4) in proportion to the faith we possess. Prayer is one of those acts that, if done in faith, will yield results.

We are Rewarded

You and I will see the reward of our faith relationship with Christ as the Holy Spirit reveals it. Enoch was rewarded for his faith (v. 5).

No Faith No Reward

We are not pleasing to God at all, without faith.
