
### What is Expectation?

Definitions of expectation:

- anticipation: anticipating with confidence of fulfillment
- the feeling that something is about to happen
- arithmetic mean: the sum of the values of a random variable divided by the number of values

The spies even brought back evidence 'and showed them the fruit of the land.' It is interesting to note the scripture says. "They gave Moses this account: 'We went into the land to which

#### All Is Well, But

They told of the wonders they had seen and then 10 of the 12 spies began to account for how difficult life would be to take possession of what had been promised them by God. <sup>28</sup>But the people who live there are powerful, and the cities are fortified and very large.

Just like many today, they would take whatever would be given but not be willing to place themselves at a perceived risk.
